The Douglas Hyde Gallery of Contemporary Art commenced operations in 1978 and was incorporated on 25 May 1984 as a company limited by guarantee not having a share capital; Company Number 101994. The company operates under the registered business name: The Douglas Hyde Gallery. The Revenue Commissioners granted charitable status to the company on 31 January 1986; reference number CHY 6700. On 15 October 2014, the company became a registered charity by virtue of the Charities Act, 2009; Charity Number: 20012953. By virtue of the same Act, the Directors and secretary of the company are deemed also to be Charity Trustees.

The Douglas Hyde is fully compliant with the Charities Regulator's Governance Code and is committed to the Principles of Good Fundraising. The Board and Staff know this commitment to the highest levels of transparency and good governance is essential to ensure an honest and open relationship with both current and prospective donors, supporters, sponsors, and partners.
